Orthodox, along with a couple of non-denominational congregations, too. After all that experimenting, though, I kept coming back to The United Methodist Church.

The thing that kept me coming back was the emphasis The United Methodist Church places on grace - and the way that our lives are held in God's grace from beginning to end. Contrary to what some folks may argue, this is not "cheap grace," but grace that has cost God everything and demands from us a response.

If you've ever done any studies that are distinctly Methodist, you'll find that we have some pretty unique vocabulary to talk about grace... words like "prevenient" and "justifying" and "sanctifying," which may leave us scratching our heads and wondering why they matter in the first place. I'll let you in on a little secret: knowing the fancy words doesn't matter nearly as much as understanding how God works in our lives. In fact, that's what grace is at its core - the unearned and undeserved work of God in our lives. We experience it most often through the Holy Spirit.

On Sunday June 6, we'll be launching into a sermon series on the thing that sets us apart as United Methodists: our convictions about God's beautiful and amazing grace. I hope you'll join us indoors or online at 10:00 a.m.!
