Our Mission: Growing Together in Christ Through Worship, Fellowship, Witness and Service

Milestones. We all have them. Birthdays. Wedding anniversaries. LinkedIn reminds all of your connections of your work anniversary. Facebook reminds us of our friends' birthdays. A lost tooth. First day of school. Graduations. So many milestones. So many opportunities to celebrate. So many opportunities to let others know we care about them.

As we mark life's milestones, change and growth, successes and sometimes failures tend to be on our minds. What did I/we accomplish? Think about those yearly school pictures showing our children's physical growth. And consider how we look at our children on their birthdays and delight in how they have matured over the last year. Milestones, it could be said, are markers of growth, including growth in maturity. And **change** is an inevitable consequence of growth.

RUMC is celebrating a significant milestone this month: our 240th anniversary in ministry in this place. Just as wedding anniversaries and birthdays tend to take us down the road of looking back over the memories of our years together or years of life, our church's anniversary can lead to thoughts of the past – as well as to reflections on **where God has led and is now leading**.

Throughout the scriptures, the Israelites celebrated again and again how God led them through the wilderness, what they promised (love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength), and the fact of God's saving love again and again in their life's journey as a people. God's steadfast, reliable love and saving grace are the bedrock of faith, making growth and change safe as we seek and rely on God's direction.

As we approach this milestone of our 240th year in ministry, our History and Records Team has chosen this scripture for the focus of our celebrating and meditation:

⁴⁶ "Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say? ⁴⁷ As for everyone who comes to me and hears my words and puts them into practice, I will show you what they are like. ⁴⁸ They are like a man building a house, who dug down deep and laid the foundation on rock. When a flood came, the torrent struck that house but could not shake it, because it was well built. ⁴⁹ But the one who hears my words and does not put them into practice is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. The moment the torrent struck that house, it collapsed and its destruction was complete." (Luke 6:46-49)

On Anniversary Sunday, February 12, Bishop LaTrelle Easterling will preach on this passage. ***Instead of waiting passively for her words to inspire us, what might happen if we each and every one reflect on this passage, seeking insight and inspiration and open hearts and minds so that we have prepared the soil of our hearts and our collective spirit to be ready to receive that day?***

A few questions to guide your reflections:

- Jot down a few of our congregation's accomplishments over the last 50 years – and a few of our mistakes or failures. What is God showing us through them?
- Where is my life firmly set on the foundation of the rock of Jesus Christ, and where are some cracks showing?

- Similarly, where is our congregational life set firmly on the foundation, and where are some cracks showing?
- How have we grown in faith and maturity – both as a congregation and as individuals?
- With Jesus as our bedrock, what do I need to do to embrace the change that comes when new disciples are sent to us by God?

Please share your reflections with me and the Church Council. I can't wait to see what God will say through you!

There are many opportunities for you to grow in your discipleship in the next couple of months, and I hope you will take a look at details in this newsletter as well as the weekly bulletins and midweek newsletters. A couple of highlights:

- **Lent** begins on March 1 with services at noon in the Northside Chapel and 7 pm in the main Sanctuary. Beginning the following Wednesday, March 8, we will be joining with at least 5 other churches for lunch and supper (choose the best time for you) for devotions and discussion on the book *Gospelled Lives*. Meals will be hosted by one church each week (a simple soup and sandwich meal for lunch and supper at the same church, assuming that each participant will choose either lunch or supper), and one of the pastors will lead a 90-minute session for the group. All participants may feel free to leave as they need to, as we are hoping that some folks will find time to come during their lunch hour.
- **Who are the important people in your lives that you need to share this with?** Begin thinking now about **two high school-aged young people** you can bring to the screening of the film *Escalation*, the story of how relationships can spiral out of control. The parents of Yeardeley Love, a college student from Cockeysville, and the foundation established in her memory, examine what we need to do when we suspect that someone we love may be in an abusive relationship. Although dating and domestic abuse is a frequent occurrence, many of us just don't think it could happen to our family or friends or we dismiss concerns, thinking they are the product of an over-active imagination. **This important community outreach event will take place on Thursday, May 18, 7 to 9 pm, in our sanctuary.** More information will follow.

The Baltimore-Washington Conference will once again be offering college scholarships for the Fall 2017 semester. **Students can apply January 3 – March 1, 2017 through an online application system.** Scholarships are available to students attending or enrolling in accredited colleges and universities in the United States. Students must be an active member of a

church for at least one year and be attending (or will attend) an accredited college or university within the United States full-time. Students will need to provide their official transcript (high school or college) and contact information for two church references (pastor and another member of the church). In addition, the student must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

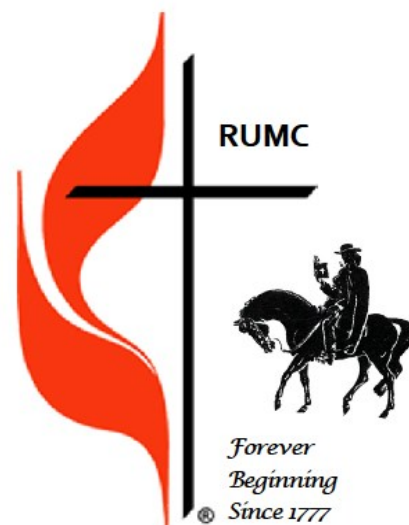
These and more are available in the Rachel Bruehl Memorial Library on the shelf closest to the desk.

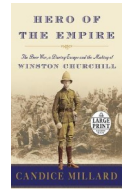

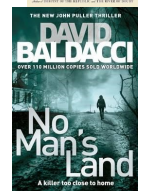

Board of Child Care - A Special Local Mission

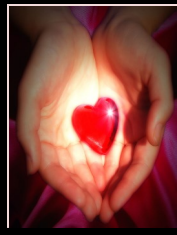
