


This year's RUMC 2017 Woman of the year is a mother of a daughter and son and is married to RUMC 2016 Man of the year.



way. She also learns new things about her mother and her mother's relationships with Whitney's late father and stepfather. Check it out for yourself in our church library.




- 1. We have several new books for your summer enjoyment. Just look for "summer" in the titles.

Christ has no body but yours; no hands, no feet on earth but yours.


Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassion on this world.





Major media outlets have featured Christopher's story and he became a YouTube sensation when the video of Open the Eyes of My Heart became viral in 2012 and has reached over 9 million views.
