From the Pastor

Love your neighbor. Jesus (Matthew 22:39)

As I write this, school begins in just a couple of weeks. Our young people will be heading back into a daily routine where they will connect with other students who are not like them. Even our youngest children are aware that there is something going on in around us that makes people mad. Grownups are arguing and the news is scary – more than usual. And they are not sheltered from the pictures of men and women spewing hatred.

How will we send our children back to school?

Please take some time in these days leading up to the opening of school to have some conversation at the family table. Open the lines of communication so that when your child (or a child you care about) is confronted with an opportunity to live faithfully in the footsteps of Jesus, your child will be able to do that:

- To stand up for children who need a friend
- To live in peace with their neighbors
- To love – even when it's hard
- To see those who are different from them as children of God – people of sacred worth made in God's image, no matter where they came from, what they look like, or what they have

Also, talk with them about what to do when they are confronted with a situation where they could be in danger. Teach them to ask for help from a trusted adult and help them to know when that is necessary. Teach them to think for themselves so that peer pressure or the emotional appeal of going along with the crowd is less likely to sway them from their calling as a disciple of Jesus.

Hatred is taught – both by word and action and just by what children see and absorb.

Love and respect are taught.

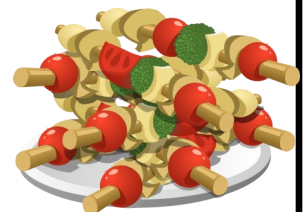

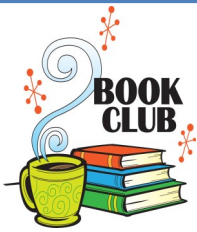


Library Log

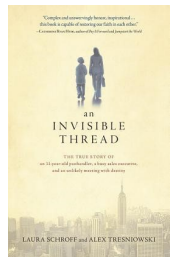

APPLE SNACKS



These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

What you need:

- 4 apples, cored and cut into 1/8" rings
- Large bowl
- Spoon
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- Baking sheets (sprayed)

What you do:

1. Place apple slices in the bowl. Add cinnamon and sugar. Stir so apples are coated evenly with the mixture.
2. Place apple slices on the sprayed baking sheets in a single layer.
3. Bake at 200 degrees for two to three hours, until chips are dry but still slightly soft.

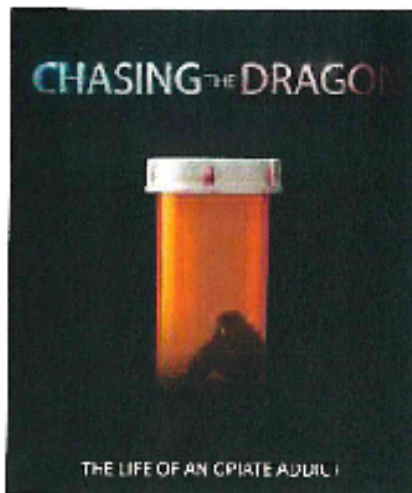
