- 4. Place the card in the plastic box.
- 5. Return the book by the due date if possible. No fines are charged for late books. Place the book in the dark bookcase in the hall or in the wire basket on the main desk.





Opioid Overdose Response Training

The Baltimore County Department of Health is offering a free, two-hour training on how to recognize, prevent and respond to an opioid overdose by using intranasal naloxone—a prescription medication that is used to reverse an overdose. Due to limited seating, preregistration is required. Please note: Overdose death rates involving <u>fentanyl</u> are rising at an alarming rate. Watch a video on the <u>dangers of fentanyl</u> and <u>learn what to do</u> before it's too late. Also view public service announcements on naloxone, stigma and the Good Samaritan Law.

2017 Training Dates

Overdose response training in Baltimore County will take place on:

- Tuesday, December 12, 6 to 8 p.m. Hereford Public Library 16940 York Road Hereford, Maryland 21111
- Tuesday, January 30, 6 to 8 p.m. Reisterstown United Methodist Church 246 Main Street Reisterstown, Maryland 21136

Who should attend?

Individuals concerned that a loved one is at risk for overdosing on heroin or prescription pain medication and those with certificates that will expire within the next three months are encouraged to attend this training.

Individuals with questions about renewing their certificates should call the Bureau of Behavioral Health at 410-887-3828.

What will I learn?

Training participants will learn:

- What an opioid is
- How to recognize, respond to and prevent an opioid overdose

How to administer intranasal naloxone to reverse an overdose

What is naloxone?

Naloxone is a prescription medicine that reverses an opioid overdose. It cannot be used to get high and it is not addictive.

What will I get for completing the training?

You will receive a completion certificate, a prescription for naloxone and a kit containing the medication.
