Yesterday, I could feel the urgency in the air as they were counting down the 19 days until the end of the session. (It reminded me that we were also counting down the days until the end of Lent and that both "seasons" will end in a burst of light and relief!)

This time I was also approached by a couple of the senators who are running in elections this fall.

Each time I have sat down to write the prayer, I have thought about public service and those who enter it, and I would like to offer yesterday's prayer to you as we begin another election cycle. Won't you pray for those who serve in public life?

Holy One,

We know you as the Source of Being,
the Source of Love,
the Source of Grace and Goodness.

We know that your love is deeper, broader and more powerful
than we can imagine or begin to truly understand.

We know that you desire the very best for each and every one of your children,
regardless of place of birth, age, ethnicity, skin color, sexuality or economic condition.
We want to be more like you.

We pray for the **courage** to stand up for your children –
to protect all of those who live on the margins
to honor the lives of every one of your children
to work for a society where your children are safe and receive what they need to feel safe and secure
to provide just and ethical structures where families can live in peace and where neighbors can rely on each other

Today, Holy One, I pray for these men and women who endeavor to serve the public.

Give them each a heart for justice, the tenacity to work for what is right, the courage to stand up when everyone around them sits down, the energy to serve each day, and the humility to

Listed here are titles of some of our new books which are drawing a lot of attention:

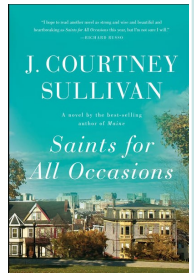
1. *I've Been Thinking* by Maria Shriver

Fast forward 50 years. Nora is the matriarch of a large family but she and her sister are still estranged. Will the truth set them free to be sisters again?



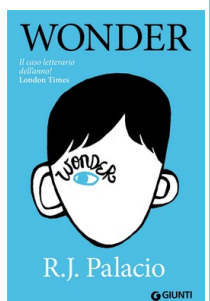
From the Shelves

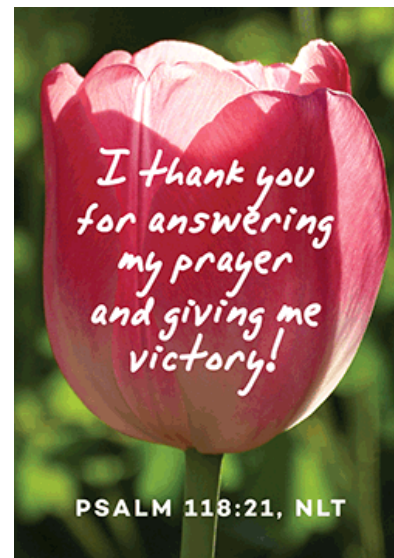

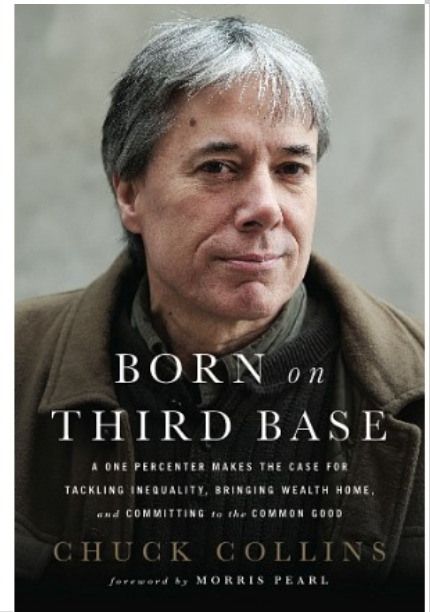

Collins, who was born into a family worth billions and lived an elite lifestyle. In 1967, he witnessed the riots in Detroit and started questioning the inequities of classes in America. Because he felt he was figuratively "born on third base", he received his Masters degree in business and then used that to help others. Because we have been exploring the idea of "white privilege" a lot in the last few years, this book of unselfishness offers a case for why those privileges should use that power to reverse the widening of the chasm between the haves and the have-nots.
