Twelve days after the birth of Jesus - January 6 - the church celebrates Epiphany, which marks the coming of the Magi and reveals that Jesus was born not just for the Jewish people, but for the Gentiles, too. Our nativity scenes and Christmas pageants make it seem as if the Magi's arrival followed right on the heels of Jesus' birth, when in reality, the journey would've taken at least three or four months. If you were in worship this past Sunday, we were reminded that the Magi, given their title in the Gospel of Matthew,

were most likely Zoroastrian priests from ancient Persia, or present-day Iran.

What is remarkable to me is that these devotees of another religion were so hungry for truth that they were willing to undertake such a long and uncertain journey. In fact, when we read Matthew 2:1-12, we immediately notice what a contrast exists between the Magi and Herod and his "Bible scholars" - the chief priests and scribes. They were so devoted to protecting the status quo that they didn't even recognize the Truth when it took on flesh and moved into the neighborhood.

As we embark on a new calendar year, making resolutions and taking stock of our goals, I pray that we would seek to be those who are hungry for truth. I pray that we would approach faith and life with humility, recognizing that there is always more for us to learn and always more ways for us to grow. And, when Jesus threatens to disrupt the status quo, I pray that we would embrace those disruptions and interruptions and, like the Magi, fall to our knees before the King of kings. In doing what must have looked like a most unusual thing - bowing before a toddler - these priests from another faith acknowledged Jesus as Lord. May that be our aim as we enter this new year: to acknowledge Jesus as Lord in all things, and to allow Him to be the Truth that guides us through this long journey called life.
