Our Mission: Growing Together in Christ Through Worship, Fellowship, Witness and Service

Ordinary Time. Yep, it's a thing. A liturgical thing, and one that is very helpful to me. Ordinary Time, though it has a very technical academic and liturgical meaning, speaks to me of the time in between the high, holy celebrations – of living in the routine of our lives. It speaks to me of God in the every day. And, fittingly, Ordinary Time takes up the majority of the Sundays of the liturgical year.

It's very easy to talk about God in startling moments of clarity or when major things happen in life. It's not so easy to find God in the every day when homework, cooking, getting to work or school on time, music or sports practice, and every item on our daily agenda is screaming for attention.

The Letter of Paul to the Romans, as translated by Eugene Pe-

terson in *The Message*, has this to say about Ordinary Time:

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds.

"So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life - your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life - and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can

do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what God wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you."

Romans 12:1-2, The Message

During this Ordinary Time, how will you do that? What tools will you use to keep your focus on God? Do you use a daily devotional book? Our weekly study guide? There is a visual devotional that is published by the General Board of Discipleship called *Sight Psalms*. You can subscribe by going to their website, and the devotional is delivered to your email: http://goo.gl/

T4uR9Z. I don't subscribe to a lot of things, but I enjoy Sight Psalms and the comment or question that comes with the picture. Another resource I found today as I have been thinking about this topic, is a booklet published online by Crossroads United Methodist Church. The booklet, My Everyday Life With God is a series of personal exercises.

FOOD DROP—MAY 15, 2015

Food Drop – On Friday May 15 we received 6,000 lbs. of food from the Maryland Food Bank (MFB) for distribution in our community. This was generously sponsored by Priority Partners who purchased about \$1300 in canned food to supplement the fresh produce normally included in the MFB Food Drop program. Priority Partners also provided reusable shopping bags and information to direct those in need of medical care to their free programs. This agency serves many homeless people in the Baltimore metropolitan area and is affiliated with Johns Hopkins. Jenn Mayer, a member of RUMC, is our contact with Priority Partners, and she has worked alongside our missions groups to bring dental supplies as well as knowledgeable speakers to educate His Hands and Feet for their work in the Reisterstown community.

We served 92 families and were blessed to be able to use the remaining food to stock our food pantry shelves. It was a joy to have over 40 volunteers turn out to help with this event – thank you all for your service and your patience as I tried to figure it all out. Enjoy the pictures from Lani! From the Food Pantry

The food pantry handed out 240 bags of food in April. Food donations have been low the last few months. Remember as we enter the summer months, children who normally eat breakfast and lunch free in school, will often not have access to food in the summer. Our demand on the food pantry increases at a time when our donors are often traveling on vacation. Our food donations drop significantly causing us to tap into our emergency funds to purchase larger volumes of food. The food pantry is in need of pant hangers. We are now accepting spring and summer clothes. Clothes should be in good condition and clean. Please do not drop off winter clothes; we have no storage for these items.

Our Community Lunch will be on June 6 at 11:30 – we served 50 meals and 38 take out in May. Our crowds have been low the last few months – so spread the word.



School Connection News



This has been a busy year for the connection with 2 schools: Cedarmere Elementary and Glyndon Elementary. We have continued to support some of the PBIS programs in each school and have provided gifts at the Christmas holi-

days. In addition, we have been available to help with food, clothing, and supplies for some special programs.

As we look ahead to the fall, we are investigating providing food over the weekend for children who are in the reduced cost lunch program at school. Cedarmere has a program called **Blessings in a Backpack** in place already. We would like to be able to find a way to do the same for children at Glyndon Elementary. Funding the program is, of course, a challenge since the annual cost is between \$80 to \$100 per child to provide food for 38 weekends each school year. So, at this time we are looking for organizations that might help with funding this project. In addition, the Maryland Food Bank may be a source to help with supplying food. In addition, we would need to have people available to help pack the backpacks for delivery to the school on Fridays, and then collect them on Monday for repacking. There is much to consider as

we gather information about this outreach opportunity. If you would like to be involved in this mission, please let someone on the Mission Committee know.


that families do not need to worry about driving in the city, paying for parking and walking




