# Gospel Reading John 12:12-36

<sup>12</sup> The next day the great crowd that had come for the festival heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. <sup>13</sup> They took palm branches and went out to meet him. They shouted, "Hosanna!

Wherever I am, there my servant will also be. My Father will honor whoever serves me. <sup>27</sup> "Now I am deeply troubled. What should I say? 'Father, save me from this time'? No, for this is the reason I have come to this time. <sup>28</sup> Father, glorify your name!" Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again."
- <sup>29</sup> The crowd standing there heard and said, "It's thunder." Others said, "An angel spoke to him."
- <sup>30</sup> Jesus replied, "This voice wasn't for my benefit but for yours. <sup>31</sup> Now is the time for judgment of this world. Now this world's ruler will be thrown out. <sup>32</sup> When I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to me." (<sup>33</sup> He said this to show how he was going to die.)
- The crowd responded, "We have heard from the Law that the Christ remains forever. How can you say that the Human One must be lifted up? Who is this Human One?"

## **Passion Reading**

Luke 22:39 - Luke 23:25

The congregation is invited to participate when prompted by the worship screen, reading the part of the "Crowd."

## The Passion According to Luke (Luke 22:39-23:25)

**Narrator:** Jesus came out and went, as was His custom, to the Mount of Olives; and the disciples followed Him. When He reached the place, He said to them,

Jesus: "Pray that you may not come into the time of trial."

Narrator: Then He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, knelt down, and prayed,

**Jesus:** "Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from me; yet, not my will but Yours be done."

**Narrator:** When He got up from prayer, He came to the disciples and found them sleeping because of grief, and He said to them,

Jesus: "Why are you sleeping? Get up and pray that you may not come into the time of trial."

**Narrator:** While He was still speaking, suddenly a crowd came, and the one called Judas, one of the twelve, was leading them. He approached Jesus to kiss Him; but Jesus said to him,

Jesus: "Judas, is it with a kiss that you are betraying the Son of Man?"

**Narrator:** When those who were around Him saw what was coming, they asked, "Lord, should we strike with the sword?" Then one of them struck the slave of the high priest and cut off his right ear. But Jesus said,

Jesus: "No more of this!"

**Narrator:** And He touched his ear and healed him. Then Jesus said to the chief priests, the officers of the temple police, and the elders who had come for Him,

**Jesus:** "Have you come out with swords and clubs as if I were a bandit? When I was with you day after day in the temple, you did not lay hands on me. But this is your hour, and the power of darkness!"

**Narrator:** Then they seized Him and led Him away, bringing Him into the high priest's house. But Peter was following at a distance. When they had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and sat down together, Peter sat among them. Then a servant-girl, seeing him in the firelight, stared at him and said, "This man also was with Him." But he denied it, saying,

Peter: "Woman, I do not know Him."

Narrator: A little later someone else, on seeing him, said, "You also are one of them." But Peter said,

Peter: "Man, I am not!"

**Narrator:** Then about an hour later still another kept insisting, "Surely this man also was with Him; for he is a Galilean." But Peter said,

Peter: "Man, I do not know what you are talking about!"

**Narrator:** At that moment, while he was still speaking, the cock crowed. The Lord turned and looked at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how He had said to him, "Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times." And he went out and wept bitterly.

At daybreak all the elders of the people assembled, including the leading priests and the teachers of religious law. Jesus was led before this high council, and they said,

Religious Leader: "Tell us, are you the Messiah?"

Narrator: But He replied,

**Jesus:** "If I tell you, you won't believe me. And if I ask you a question, you won't answer. But from now on the Son of Man will be seated in the place of power at God's right hand."

Narrator: They all shouted,

Religious Leader: "So, are You claiming to be the Son of God?"

Narrator: And He replied,

Jesus: "You say that I am."

Religious Leader: "Why do we need other witnesses? We ourselves heard Him say it."

**Narrator:** Then the entire council took Jesus to Pilate, the Roman governor. They began to state their case:

**Religious Leader:** "This man has been leading our people astray by telling them not to pay their taxes to the Roman government and by claiming He is the Messiah, a king."

Narrator: So Pilate asked Him,

Pilate: "Are you the King of the Jews?"

Narrator: Jesus replied,

Jesus: "You have said it."

Narrator: Pilate turned to the leading priests and to the crowd and said,

Pilate: "I find no basis for an accusation against this man."

**Narrator:** Then they became insistent.

**Religious Leader:** "But He is causing riots by His teaching wherever He goes—all over Judea, from Galilee to Jerusalem!"

Narrator: Pilate asked,

Pilate: "Oh, is He a Galilean?"

Narrator: When they said that He was, Pilate sent Him to Herod Antipas, because Galilee was under Herod's jurisdiction, and Herod happened to be in Jerusalem at the time. Herod was delighted at the opportunity to see Jesus, because he had heard about Him and had been hoping for a long time to see Him perform a miracle. He asked Jesus question after question, but Jesus refused to answer. Meanwhile, the leading priests and the teachers of religious law stood there shouting their accusations. Then Herod and his soldiers began mocking and ridiculing Jesus. Finally, they put a royal robe on Him and sent Him back to Pilate. (Herod and Pilate, who had been enemies before, became friends that day.) Then Pilate called together the leading priests and other religious leaders, along with the people, and he announced his verdict.

**Pilate:** "You brought this man to me, accusing Him of leading a revolt. I have examined Him thoroughly on this point in your presence and find Him innocent. Herod came to the same conclusion and sent Him back to us. He has done nothing to deserve death. So I will have Him flogged, and then I will release Him."

Narrator: Then a mighty roar rose from the crowd, and with one voice they shouted,

Crowd: "Kill Him, and release Barabbas to us!"

**Narrator:** (Barabbas was in prison for taking part in an insurrection in Jerusalem against the government, and for murder.) Pilate argued with them, because he wanted to release Jesus. But they kept shouting,

Crowd: "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!"

Narrator: For the third time he demanded,

**Pilate:** "Why? What crime has He committed? I have found no reason to sentence Him to death. So I will have Him flogged, and then I will release Him."

Narrator: But the crowd shouted louder and louder:

Crowd: "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!"

**Narrator:** They demanded that Jesus be crucified, and their voices prevailed. So Pilate sentenced Jesus to die as they demanded. He released the man they asked for, the one who had been put in prison for insurrection and murder, and he handed Jesus over as they wished.
