### The Most Important Thing

Many of you know that this is our family's first year with a child in public school. Navigating the school year pandemic-style has brought the need for organization and nightly prepping to a whole new level. Just a couple of weeks ago, I was driving my daughter to her Kindergarten pod - the home of a family in our pandemic "bubble," where the kids are guided through their virtual school day by a former teacher - when I realized that I had forgotten to pack her laptop. I had remembered her lunch, her pod-day pencil box, her headphones and her extra mask, but I had completely forgotten the most important thing - literally the only thing she could not do without. I was kicking myself for not having packed her things the night before, and for abandoning the pod-day checklist that we had made at the beginning of the school year. We immediately turned around, and given what time it was, we settled on her doing the first portion of her virtual school day from home.

When it comes to our life of faith, Jesus reminds us of what is most important when he is questioned by a teacher of the law: *"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment."* - Matthew 22:37-38

These words were first given to the Israelites by Moses and are recorded in Deuteronomy 6. So that they wouldn't forget to observe this all-important commandment, God added further instructions: *"Recite [these words] to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates"* (Deut. 6:7-8).

In the homes of my Jewish friends, to each doorway is affixed a small decorated box that holds a mezuzah, a scroll containing the words from Deuteronomy 6. The greatest commandment is also the center of their morning and evening prayers. These things help them to remember that this command to wholehearted devotion, a devotion that calls us to love God with all that we are—heart, soul, mind and strength—is the most important thing they can do each day.

How do you keep from losing sight of what's most important? With the countless distractions that we encounter every day and the challenges that direct our hearts and minds elsewhere, how do you remember your God-given purpose for living? One of the things that has helped me most of all is
