#### From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

Have you ever thought about the significance in the places Jesus went? During Lent and then also on Easter, our theme is Walking with Jesus, and we will examine what each place Jesus walked has to say to us in our own walks with Christ.

Ash Wednesday: Preparing for the Journey – Any time we go on a trip, whether it's for business, family visits or vacation, there is preparation required. We need to take the right equipment and plan. On Ash Wednesday, the service will be experiential, honing the most important tools for any journey with Jesus: scripture and prayer.

Lent 1: Standing Fast in the Wilderness (March 9) – Wilderness can be a place or even a state of mind. The questions for this Sunday are: How did Jesus withstand the pressures of the wilderness? How can we?

Lent 2: Exploring Jerusalem with Nick - at Night (March 16) - Jerusalem, seat of power and location of the temple. Nicodemus, rich and powerful. Ashkel How might the fact of the power of the place and the man help us to understand today's scripture that includes the famous passage, "You Gelnside this issue: must be born again?"

Lent 3: A Side Trip to Samaria (March 23) - Samaria, for a Jew, was no-man's land! Yet, a woman of ill repute found that a hated Jew just might understand her. When we travel through places that are unfamiliar and unfriendly, how might we experience and offer un- Jerusalem. As he enters derstanding?

Lent 4: Stopping by the Temple (March 30) - Last year, the Healing of the Blind Man passage focused on the beginning of the story. Jesus met the man after being in the temple, and after the healing the man went to show himself to the temple leaders. Imagine the furor and the machinations that took place in that holy space when the leaders learned of how Jesus "showed them up."

Lent 5: An Emergency Dash to Bethany (April 6) - Bethany, though not Jesus' birthplace, was like going home for Jesus. What did it mean for Jesus to delay his trip to Bethany when his best friends called for him?

Lent 6: By the Side of His Donkey (April 13 - Palm/Passion Sunday) -On this day, we will be part of the crowd watching as Jesus enters

#### How to Become a Member of RUMC
