Field Trip to Mission Central—March 12, 2016 So what is UMCOR and why is it important to us at RUMC?

UMCOR stands for the United Methodist Committee on Relief. It provides humanitarian relief and disaster response in the United States and internationally. Efforts are targeted in places where natural disasters, war, or conflict have done so much damage that munities are unable to recover on

Some of the ways and places where UMCOR has helped:






