as the basis for a time of sharing where your leaders feel the church must go in the next year. What an exciting time!

May also brings with it several RUMC Faith Family celebrations. Chief among those celebrations is Pentecost, the birthday of the church, and the Sunday when we celebrate a most precious faith RUMC Faith Family event: Confirmation. On that day we will celebrate eight of our youth who will make their own commitment to a life of discipleship and love for Jesus. 
