Entitled *Breathe*, the photo was of a stunning sunset sky with beautiful shades of blue and purple and orange and gold glimpsed through a waterside structure that looks like one of the squat lighthouses but is open all around so you can see the water and sunset through the structure. It looks a little bit like a tabernacle, but it could be a fancy picnic pavilion. It reminded me of lace.

The caption: With each sunrise and each sunset, breathe in God's love, breathe out fear.

Breathe. This week we are beginning a new worship series on the Holy Spirit – who frequently breathes new life into people and even the whole of creation in the scripture stories. The work of the Holy Spirit is as necessary as breath and as reassuring as the rhythm of sunrise and sunset. Without breath, we die. Without the Holy Spirit, we lack the oxygen of God's presence, energy, and power in our lives. Imagine what it's like when we can't catch our breath, and let's pray together: *Come, Holy Spirit!*

I hope you will be part of this worship time with us.

During the week of April 27, we are trying out another online platform for worship. You may have heard of Zoom which I think I'm hearing about in just about every single conversation I'm having lately. We have learned that there is a setting in Zoom that may help us with the sound production, particularly the music, which I know is important to all of us! By the time you receive this newsletter, you should have already received **the call in and login information for Zoom "meetings" that we will be using at least through Sunday, May 3.** (We will continue to have it on the website's home page and publish it in the midweek communications as well.) If it works better, that's what we will continue to use. The other feature that we hope will help is that we can subscribe for more participants and hope that the app has better access so that neither I nor any of you will get bumped out of the session. Please remember that if you don't have unlimited long distance on your phone, we will reimburse you for those charges – just send us your bill.

Two things you need to know:

As of right now, we are definitely closed through May 15, and possibly longer,

depending on what the governor decides based on the statistics prior to that date. The bishop has been very clear that we are following the lead of the governor.

That said, the staff is actively working toward what a return to "in-person-worship" will mean for us. Governor Hogan's *Roadmap to Recovery* document that was published last week says that the first step will be small group outdoor worship experiences. There was also an indication the week before that part of the plan would be to then begin worshiping in groups of 50 using social distancing. We believe that would be the next step after the outdoor services, but we are "staying tuned" to directions from the governor before we go too far down any track. The main thing is to keep all of us safe! *We are also exploring a continuation of online worship, possibly with streaming and phone (listening only) participation.* At the present time, we are posting both the worship service script and a video of the meditation only on the church's website. *Each week, the meditation can be found at the very bottom of the website home page: rumcweb.org.*

Breathe, friends. Just breathe. And know that you are breathing in the Spirit and breathing out all fear.

From the Treasurer:

First of all, thank you to the many people who continue to give to the church by mailing in their offerings. If you would like to change to on-line giving, please email me at pat.botelle2@gmail.com and I will help you get started.

Many people don't feel comfortable using the online giving option that is available through the church's website. Because we use Farmers and Merchants as our bank, online apps such as Zelle don't work for RUMC. Most banks offer online bill pay. You can set up the church as a "bill" using your envelope number as your account number (if you don't have an envelope number, just put in 9999). Put the church's name and address in and then you can have the bank send the check (yes, they pay the postage!). You can set this up as a one-time event or as a recurring payment.

I do hope you consider online giving. The service we use is very secure and recommended by the General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA) of The United Methodist Church.

We also have text giving available thru Realm.

Text Give2RUMC \$xx to 73256 to give to RUMC using your text messaging. Standard text message rates do apply. You can also give to Food Pantry, Local Missions and Easter by selecting the Fund when prompted. The first time you text your gift, you will be prompted to enter your credit/debit card information or you can change the account type to checking or savings and enter your routing and account numbers. You only have to do this once then you are all set to give by text.


