(and deep!) glacial canyon walls were filled with icy water, carving many cataracts for waterfalls and giving the area a climate that is perfect for food crops.

But why would the water flow the opposite way? I'm not sure I really know (unless it was because the locks were open for boat traffic at that time), and I'm not sure it really matters. But it made me consider how the expected is not always the direction that God takes us – or that God urges us to go.

We know that it's easier to paddle with the flow. When we try to paddle against the current, it takes muscles – maybe some that we don't exercise very often. It takes determination – since it's not the easy pathway. It opens up new possibilities. And maybe it's right there that we find the wonder of taking God's pathway.

We all know that God is there for us when we are in need of comfort, torn apart by grief or crisis. There is a familiarity – grace to help in time of need. And we all rely on that familiarity of faith to get us through the tough times.

However, when it comes to being the church, God rarely leads us on a worn pathway – one that may feel tried and true and comfortable but may not be what is necessary for the day or the times or the changing world.

Years ago, a friend and colleague put together a little book of faith exercises, and one of them was a simple question: Today, is your faith more like a rock or a pillow? (cont. on page 2)

We need "pillow days" when faith offers the comfort needed at the end of a long, hard day - when it kind of wraps us up and we can just say "Ahhhhhhhhh!"

But we also need "rock days" when faith is making us wonder what's next. When we can't really rest. When the rock won't let us be still and satisfied with business as usual. When God is drawing us into something that may not be easy.

If your faith has been "pillow-like" for awhile, maybe it's time to look up and see if the current is flowing in an odd direction and discern whether it's time to paddle a new course. If we just keep on keeping on, what beauty, what adventure, what joy might we miss out on?

History and Records page on our website (rumcweb.org/about/historical records) and click on the link you want to see. There are membership records dating back to 1866 and go to 1940. There are also minutes from Board of Trustees 1833 to 1926, and Administrative/ Official Board minutes from 1915 to1978. The History and Records Team has also converted VHS tapes from VIM trips and concerts to CD so you can watch them in the library. \*Note that they are not available for circulation. They are located in the cabinet above the computer.


