LIBRARY LOG



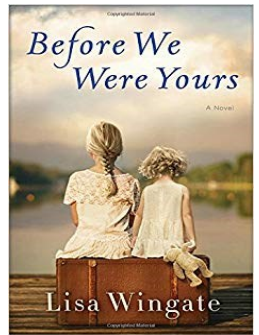
1. You may have noticed that the library has been trying to install a charging station, and we are having a difficult time. Please be patient while we try to be electrical engineers.

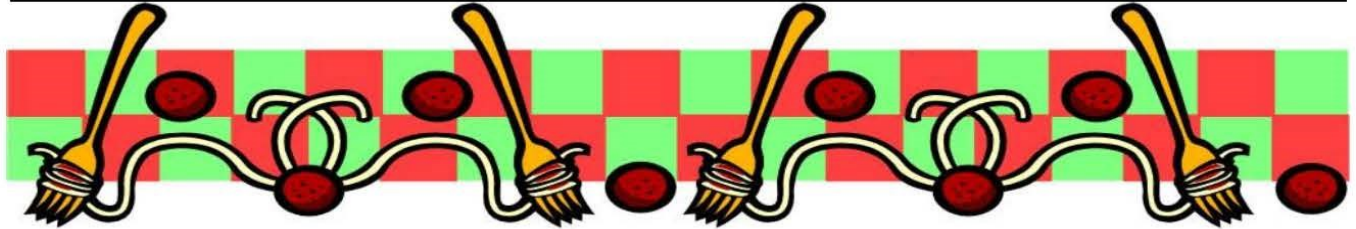

OUT-OF-THE-BOX MINISTRY IDEA-

The Church Council of RUMC has approved continued work on a plan for an Out-of-the Box Ministry.

We have the opportunity to create a Coffeeshop to act as a modern-day outpost where the church and greater Reisterstown community connect.

WHY: Churches throughout the country have struggled to maintain an active youth and young adult presence in local communities. Not only does Reisterstown lack a place for this population to connect, but many in this age group are no longer associated with a church or have never been engaged in a traditional church.

SOLUTION: A coffee shop can provide an environment that draws people in for a great cup of coffee or tea with a welcoming atmosphere and keep people coming back for authentic conversations. By creating an environment rooted in love, connection, and discipleship, we can demonstrate Jesus's love for all.

RESEARCH: A team at RUMC has visited church affiliated coffee houses in the Baltimore-Washington area, consulted an architect with experience planning a church-affiliated coffeehouse, researched coffee & food costs, completed initial proforma, researched locations on main street, and met with a Coffee Shop Consultant to help with a business plan. A proposal was presented to the Church Council on November 27, 2018 and was followed up with an additional information on Feb. 23rd at the church council retreat.

PLAN: The Church Council has reviewed the approved next steps and further research to create a Coffeeshop so that the church and community can cross paths.

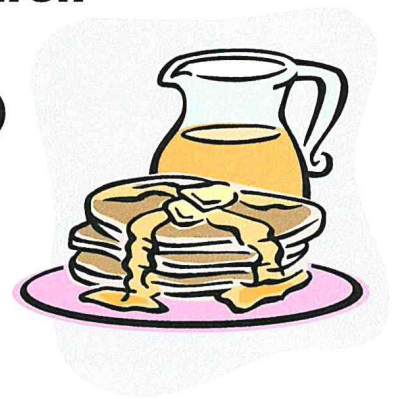

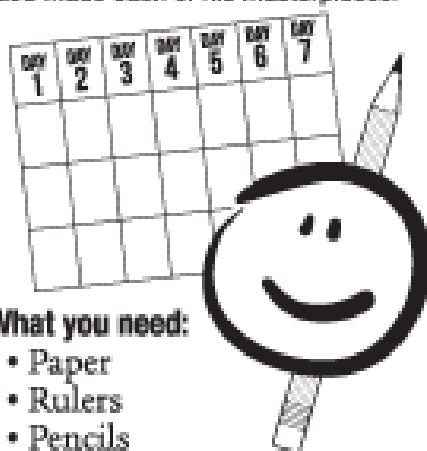
