Dear Church Family,

I was recently reminded of the statistic that 80% of people abandon their New Year's resolutions by February. Of the people who are still going strong, numerically less than half will carry their resolutions through to the end of the year. That means only about 5-10% of people who start the year with goals for selfimprovement or positive lifestyle changes actually see them through - a pretty bleak outlook if you ask me.

There was a time when I approached Lenten disciplines as if they were New Year's resolutions for my faith. After all, the liturgy says that Lent is a time for "turning around and beginning again" - an opportunity for us to hit the "reset" button on our faith. As you might imagine, though, my follow-through was not much better than the average resolution-maker. Invariably, I'd beat myself up for not trying hard enough, believing that the problem was about a lack of effort.

I've learned a lot about myself since then, and also a lot more about spiritual formation and how real, lasting change takes place.

The culprit is not our effort. Every year on Ash Wednesday, we hear or pray the words, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me" (Psalm 51:10). What we do when we speak these words is acknowledge that transformation is God's work. It's not something we do to ourselves.

At the same time, we are also not passive participants in that work. To be sure, God can transform people when they are least expecting it and perhaps not even seeking it. Those situations are a bit analogous to an image I've seen of a flower growing out of a crack in the road. We look at that and see it as miraculous, because we know that is generally not the way flowers grow. Most flowers, like people, grow when they are surrounded by the right conditions for growth. In Lent, we can do our part in God's transforming work by creating the conditions that allow transformation to take place - not by trying harder.

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, we will embark on a study of James Bryan Smith's book, The Good and Beautiful God. It aims to help us abandon the false and unhelpful narratives we tell ourselves about God (e.g. "God wants me to try harder.") and place ourselves instead in the right environment for growth. Each week we will take on a different "soul training exercise" to help us, which may be a bit different from the New Year's resolution-style approach to Lenten disciplines many of us are used to. It also suggests that being in community with others is vital to the process of transformation.

If you aren't currently part of a small group community, I would encourage you to connect in with one of our Lenten study groups. There are three opportunities to participate virtually in the Lenten Study: Sundays at 6:30 p.m., Wednesdays at 1:00 p.m., and a group just for men on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. If none of those times work for you, you opt to read through the book with a few friends or just follow along in your own devotional time.

A Message from your Finance Committee:

Thank you so much for your support of RUMC in 2020. We started 2020 with a MMITTEE deficit from 2019, but our additional pledge campaign helped cover that deficit. Then in March, we had to shut down because of the pandemic. You continued your giving through that time and RUMC was able to secure a Payroll Protection Program (PPP) Loan in April. This loan helped us cover salaries for the Nursery School and Church staff for eight weeks and helped us get through the summer and fall.

RUMC ended the year with strong giving that allowed us to break even - not taking into consideration the PPP loan. In January, we received notification that our PPP loan was forgiven.

As we begin the new year, RUMC continues to need your support. Regular giving not only helps us grow in our faith, but it also helps us in our planning (not to mention it helps keep my blood pressure under control!!). 
