Dear Friends,

When I was in seminary, U2's 360 Tour came to Raleigh, NC. It featured a revolving stage, which transformed mid-concert and allowed everyone in the stadium to have views of Bono and the Edge. I had followed U2 since middle school, so I was pumped when I found out they'd be in the city next door. I got up early the day tickets went on sale and sat with my finger over the mouse, waiting for the sale to come online. The show sold out within minutes, but I managed to score five tickets in the upper seats for \$65 each, which was a lot for a minimally-employed seminary student.

The night of the show, my friends and I all piled into one car and started heading toward Raleigh. But we were soon in for a rude awakening. It seemed like half the state was heading to the stadium, and even though we had left home with plenty of time to spare, I-40 was a parking lot. I have never seen anything like it since, not even at the holidays. People were literally abandoning their cars on the side of the interstate and running the last few miles to the stadium. Since those were the days before iPhones and none of us was wealthy enough to own a GPS, we didn't feel like we had enough data - or stamina - to take that sort of risk. We stayed in the car and crawled along at a painful snail's pace, knowing we were going to miss some of the show. At one point, something like despair hit our crew, because we started to question whether we should drive across the grass median and head back home - we were so bummed at the thought of being late to the party.

We persevered, though, and when we finally arrived at the stadium, the parking situation was predictably chaotic. As we drove around with our windows down, we could tell that the opening act had wrapped up, and the countdown was on for U2 to take the stage. When we were finally able to park, it was in a field a good half mile away from the stadium's entrance. We were going to miss the start of the set. And we did - several songs worth. We made it to our seats right in time for the opening riff of "Beautiful Day" - and the rest was incredible. I'm not sure I've ever been to a show that was so well-orchestrated and choreographed, so musically varied, and so thoughtful in the way that it engaged the audience and called us to action. I'm sort of joking when I say that it was a spiritual experience, but only sort of. ;)

So why tell you all this? We were late. We had missed a good deal of what we were supposed to have experienced. And yet, I was so thankful we didn't throw in the towel and go back home, because what we did experience was well worth our time.
