First Reading

Psalm 6

- ¹ O Lord, do not rebuke me in your anger, or discipline me in your wrath.
- ² Be gracious to me, O Lord, for I am languishing; O Lord, heal me, for my bones are shaking with terror.
- ³ My soul also is struck with terror, while you, O Lord—how long?
- ⁴ Turn, O Lord, save my life; deliver me for the sake of your steadfast love.
- ⁵ For in death there is no remembrance of you; in Sheol who can give you praise?
- ⁶ I am weary with my moaning; every night I flood my bed with tears; I drench my couch with my weeping.
- ⁷ My eyes waste away because of grief; they grow weak because of all my foes.
- ⁸ Depart from me, all you workers of evil, for the Lord has heard the sound of my weeping.
- ⁹ The Lord has heard my supplication; the Lord accepts my prayer.
- ¹⁰ All my enemies shall be ashamed and struck with terror; they shall turn back, and in a moment be put to shame.

Second Reading Matthew 27:33-46

- ³³ When they came to a place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull), ³⁴ they offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. ³⁵ And when they had crucified him, they divided his clothes among themselves by casting lots; ³⁶ then they sat down there and kept watch over him. ³⁷ Over his head they put the charge against him, which read, "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews."
- ³⁸ Then two bandits were crucified with him, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁹ Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads ⁴⁰ and saying, "You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself! If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross." ⁴¹ In the same way the chief priests also, along with the scribes and elders, were mocking him, saying, ⁴² "He saved others; he cannot save himself. He is the King of

Israel; let him come down from the cross now, and we will believe in him. ⁴³ He trusts in God; let God deliver him now, if he wants to; for he said, 'I am God's Son.'" ⁴⁴ The bandits who were crucified with him also taunted him in the same way.

⁴⁵ From noon on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. ⁴⁶ And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"
