💢 As you know, many Afghan refugees left their homes with little more than the clothes they were wearing. Most worked with the US forces, NATO or other NGOs. For this they were targeted by the Taliban. Many families will be resettled in the Baltimore area and their needs are great. We will be working with Afghan Resettlement Program. This list indicates some of the many items the families will need.

Kitchen: knives 3 different types, set of pots with lids

Bedrooms: bed pillows, twin size blankets or comforters, twin set of sheets, Full/Queen blankets or comforters, full/queen set of sheets

Bathroom: shower curtain and rings, toilet brush and holder, toilet paper (12 pack) Desk supplies: note paper and pens, pencils Large plastic bins to hold clothes Cleaning supplies: sponges, vacuum, broom and dust pan Hygiene: men's and women's deodorant, pack of feminine hygiene pads, pack of razors and shaving cream), toothbrushes

Foods: sugar, salt, black tea, bag of rice

Furniture: couch, armchairs, dining table and chairs for 5-6 people, 2 dresser or chests of drawers, twin bed frame, double/ queen bed frame, coffee table, side tables, television, table lamps, floor lamps


