Dear RUMC Family,

This Wednesday, March 2, we enter the season of Lent. Lent is a 40-day season, not including Sundays, that is modeled after the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness before beginning his ministry. During that time, Jesus was tempted, but he overcame all of those temptations and emerged from the wilderness clear about his identity and purpose and unwavering in His devotion to God.

That’s the reason we observe the season of Lent, too. In Lent, we are invited to “enter the wilderness,” so that we might emerge at the end of 40 days with a greater sense of identity and purpose and a renewed commitment to God. Why the wilderness? Well, Jesus’ 40 days actually echo the 40 years that the Israelites spent in the wilderness before entering the Promised Land. There in the desert, the people of God were forced into a rhythm of daily trust and dependence upon God. Without the food God provided (manna and quail) and without the shelter God offered (the pillar of cloud and the pillar of fire), they would not have survived. The vulnerability and discomfort of the wilderness was the perfect setting for them to unlearn the ways of Egypt and learn the ways of the Lord. Sometimes it takes a good bit of discomfort to make us teachable.

Like many people, I have an aversion to discomfort. I’d much prefer to do what is safe and easy than to do the things that are risky, hard, and uncertain. But there’s another part of me that knows the easy, comfortable, predictable journey does not lead to wholeness or abundant life. And ultimately, those are the things I crave - a relationship with God that is as free and natural as breathing; confidence in my identity as God’s beloved child; and a clear sense of purpose. Every now and then, I need to get back to the wilderness.

That’s why we have Lent. Every year, it invites us to embark on a less-than-comfortable journey of spiritual disciplines, confession and introspection that is ultimately designed to lead to new life. May this wilderness in which we find ourselves be the wilderness in which we find our true selves.

This year, Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, falls on March 2. During worship services that day, pastors in many Christian churches dip a finger in ashes (often made by burning branches from the previous Palm Sunday) and make a cross on parishioners' foreheads. Why ashes? Traditionally, they're a sign of mourning, humiliation and penitence. Ashes also represent the frailty and temporary nature of human life ("You are dust, and to dust you shall return," Genesis 3:19). Christians are pained because our sins led to Jesus' death. With repentant hearts, we begin the season of Lent, knowing that it leads to Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday.



For Ash Wednesday — and throughout the 40 days of Lent — ponder this prayer from an Italian sacramentary, or liturgical book: "O God, you know how fragile is our human nature, wounded as it is by sin. Help your people to enter upon the Lenten journey strengthened by the power of your word, so that we may be victorious over the seduction of the Evil One and reach the paschal feast in the joy of the Holy Spirit."
