Our woman of the year was born in Chula Vista, California in 1953.

Her father was a career naval officer. Because of his varied assignments, the woman of the year and her family lived throughout California and even spent three years on Guam.

She graduated from Bonita Vista High School, near San Diego, where she was the Secretary of her class and a member of the Drill team. She also enjoyed playing sports and once even hit a double in Angels stadium at a softball game.



For college, she attended UCLA where she earned a degree in Kinesiology. While at UCLA she got a part-time job at Washington Inventory Service and ended up marrying her boss. Thankfully HR did not get involved!

After she graduated college, her husband was promoted and in 1978 they were transferred to Baltimore. Soon after moving, they welcomed their first child, a son. Shortly thereafter, she answered the calling to become a Registered Nurse. She attended the University of Maryland Nursing School and while in nursing school had a second child, a daughter. And barely a year later, surprise!, a second daughter. Despite having three very young children, she finished nursing school in two years and started a 17 year career as an ICU nurse at Northwest Hospital Center.

After leaving Northwest, she embarked upon a new career at CareFirst, initially as a case manager and ultimately as the Manager of Central Appeals. She spent 19 years with CareFirst before retiring in 2016.

As previously mentioned, she has three children who have blessed her with six beautiful grandchildren who she loves more than anything... most of the time! Despite working grueling 12- hours shifts at the hospital, she was an amazing mother who prioritized her kids. She even found time to be the President of the Glyndon Elementary PTA. She provided them with amazing childhoods full of travel and experiences and set high standards for them, molding them into the adults they would ultimately become. Now she spends as much time as possible with her grandchildren, watching them play sports and taking them on their own adventures.

When the Woman of the Year and her husband moved to the Baltimore area from the West Coast, they knew no one, so finding a church family was important to them. Thankfully, they found RUMC.

It didn't take her long to become actively involved in the church. She was an early member of the VIM teams as she had a passion for giving and helping people. Ask her kids, she took their Nintendo on a mission trip and donated it without telling them.

She has gone on and led more VIM trips than we can even count at this point and shows no signs of stopping once COVID allows them to continue.

For the last 6 years she has been the site coordinator for Mission of Mercy. She handles the scheduling of the patients and works with other volunteers to provide local patients with medical care and services that they could otherwise not afford.

When COVID started to show signs of improvement she was asked to be part of the Church Reentry Committee. She has been a huge part of helping the food pantry run for the last several years and at the end of this past year, when I (Kris) stepped back as Coordinator, our recipient, along with other long-time volunteers, stepped up to form a team of leaders to help transition and keep things running.

She is also Treasurer of J.O.Y., active in running the annual Holly Fair, and a member of our Handbell musicians. For some reason the choir didn't seem like the best fit!

SAFE GATHERING APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Purpose of Safe Gathering Application

The Reisterstown United Methodist Church (RUMC) is a church family that places the care and safety of our church congregants and community members as one of our highest values. If you are a staff member, thank you for your service to our congregation and community. If you are a volunteer, thank you for offering your time in service to God's children and help in growing disciples.

Safe Gatherings is a service we are utilizing to ensure that we are providing a safe environment for all children and youth as we conduct church gatherings, community activities or outreach programs. As we utilize the Safe Gatherings application, we are providing parents and guardians with the level of commitment at RUMC to ensure their children and youth will be in the caring hands of staff and safe environment with volunteers that have submitted to background checks. RUMC will pay for the processing of Safe Gatherings applications. **All staff and volunteers that will interact with children or youth will need to complete the online Safe Gatherings application AND Training. Once the application process is completed, the office will receive a report once the background checks, references contacted and training is completed.**

Outline of Safe Gatherings application input and process

Information needed during submission of application:

Name & Address

Names, phone numbers and email addresses for two references. NOTE: Please contact your references prior to submitting your Safe Gatherings application. Let them know to be looking for an email or phone call from Safe Gatherings and ensure that they are willing to provide the reference.

Social Security Number

Driver's License – ONLY IF YOU WILL BE DRIVING CHILDREN or YOUTH

The Safe Gatherings process will include the following:

Processing of two references | National criminal background check

7 year county residence background check | National and State residence Sex Offender Registry Check

2 hour online abuse prevention and boundary awareness training.

How to submit a Safe Gatherings application:

Log onto the following website – www.safegatherings.com

Click on "New User" to get started.

Click on SIGN UP to create your Safe Gatherings login. If you have previously completed a Safe Gatherings application, utilize the LOGIN section.

Click on the drop down arrow for CHOOSE YOUR TYPE OF ORGANIZATION and select "Church or Faith Based Organization "

A subsequent drop down will appear TO WHAT DENOMINATION DOES YOUR CHURCH OR CONGREGATION BELONG. Click on the drop down list and choose "Methodist".

Click on the drop down list for SELECT THE STATE/PROVINCE FOR YOUR ORGANIZATION and select "Maryland".

Click on the box for TYPE THE MOST UNIQUE PART OF YOUR ORGANIZATION NAME and type in "Reisterstown".

A selection list will appear below. Select "Reisterstown United Methodist Church".

Verify that "Reisterstown" appears in the CITY IN WHICH YOUR ORGANIZATION IS LOCATED. Click on NEXT to advance to the next screen.

Complete the application questions by making selections from the drop down boxes.

John Wesley's General Rules

1. ***Do no harm; avoid evil of every kind***
2. ***Do all the good you can, as far as possible, to all persons.***
3. ***Attend to the ordinances of God (Stay in Love with God):***
 - a. ***Public Worship***
 - b. ***The ministry of the Word***
 - c. ***The Lord's Supper***
 - d. ***Family and Private prayer***
 - e. ***Searching the scriptures***
 - f. ***Fasting or abstinence***

Matthew 28:16-20 16-17 Meanwhile, the eleven disciples were on their way to Galilee, headed for the mountain Jesus had set for their reunion. The moment they saw him they worshiped him. Some, though, held back, not sure about worship, about risking themselves totally.

18-20 Jesus, undeterred, went right ahead and gave his charge: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day, right up to the end of the age."

***Reflect and discuss:**

1. John Wesley, Methodism's founder, advised:
"Do no harm. Do good. Stay in love with God."
What do you appreciate about these rules? If you could choose one to work on in the coming days, which would it be? How might your life be different if you took these rules to heart?
2. What do you think about the Micah verse?
3. Think about how people pour themselves out as they serve like Christ. What makes them special. Identify ways at camp you might serve like Christ, to those around you.
4. Imagine you were asked to write a set of rules to assist your congregation "to make disciples for the transformation of the world." What rules would you suggest?

Prayer: God is present. We have a God willing to stand with us in the midst of the fiery furnace; a God willing to stand with us in the fiery furnace of mission. Let us go into the depths of the fire and be present to our brothers and sisters who are crying out for help. In your name we pray. Amen
