As I scrolled through my feed, I couldn't help but notice how many of them were captioned with the phrase, "So-and-so is living their best life!" I didn't think much about it until I started getting text messages from caregivers and family members who were with my kids at camp or the pool, letting me know that my kids, too, were living their best lives.

Now, the idea of "living your best life" is not new. It's been a part of our culture for a number of years, made popular

by Joel Osteen's *Your Best Life Now* (2007), or Oprah Magazine's *Live Your Best Life* (2005). However, more recently it's come to mean something very different from the original premise of those books, which painted pictures of a life lived to its full potential, of self-awareness and growth. Those gifts are ours when we follow Jesus and when we begin to understand the depth of God's love for us and for the world.

I hope you'll join us on October 9 as we kick off our series, *The Good Life*, which I promise won't look anything like a sunny Facebook reel. Instead it will help us wrestle with those things that sometimes get in the way of following Jesus and experiencing His gift of abundant life. If you're in town and feeling well, I hope you'll join in person. And if not, we have plenty of opportunities for you to join us online - via our website's live stream, Facebook, YouTube, and Zoom.
