Dear friends,

Over the summer, my social media accounts were flooded with photos of friends on vacation, little kids trying things for the very first time, and people engaging in much-needed self-care. As I scrolled through my feed, I couldn't help but notice how many of them were captioned with the phrase, "*So-and-so* is living their best life!" I didn't think much about it until I started getting text messages from caregivers and family members who were with my kids at camp or the pool, letting me know that my kids, too, were living their best lives.

Now, the idea of "living your best life" is not new. It's been a part of our culture for a number of years, made popular by Joel Osteen's *Your Best Life Now* (2007), or Oprah Magazine's *Live Your Best Life* (2005). However, more recently it's come to mean something very different from the original premise of those books, which painted pictures of a life lived to its full potential, of self-awareness and growth. Today "living your best life" has become synonymous with "living the dream" - experiencing life to the fullest.

While I'm not opposed to either of those things - living to one's full potential or experiencing life to the fullest - I'm not sure that either of those things are what Jesus had in mind when He came to give us abundant life. One of my seminary classmates, author and speaker Kate Bowler, recently started giving her podcast listeners permission to live their "okay-est life now" - with the understanding that Jesus didn't come to offer prosperity or endless fun, but beauty, joy and peace in the midst of a world that can be messy, hard and painful. Those gifts are ours when we follow Jesus and when we begin to understand the depth of God's love for us and for the world.

I hope you'll join us on October 9 as we kick off our series, *The Good Life*, which I promise won't look anything like a sunny Facebook reel. Instead it will help us wrestle with those things that sometimes get in the way of following Jesus and experiencing His gift of abundant life. If you're in town and feeling well, I hope you'll join in person. And if not, we have plenty of opportunities for you to join us online - via our website's live stream, Facebook, YouTube, and Zoom.
