Dear friends,

I wanted to give an update on the work of our Catalyst Initiative team, which has been busy working through our second learning module on empathy. At its most basic, empathy is "feeling *with* someone." Brené Brown has a great animated video that depicts a person crying out from a deep, dark hole. Empathy looks like another person climbing down in the hole beside them and saying, "I know what it's like down here. You're not alone." Sympathy, on the other hand, looks like the person who calls down from above, saying: "Oooh, it's bad down there!" Of the two responses, empathy is the one that fuels connection.

Brené points out that empathy is a choice, and it's a vulnerable choice. In order to connect with someone, we have to connect with something in ourselves that knows the feeling they're experiencing. Even though her teaching on empathy isn't specifically "Christian," her illustration reminds me an awful lot of what God did in the incarnation - taking on flesh and coming down to live among us. It was a vulnerable choice, but in making that choice, God said unequivocally, "I know what it's like down here, and you're not alone."

Choosing empathy is a part of what it means to be like Christ. It's also what will drive our connection with people in the community as we hope to share with them the life-giving news about Jesus. Since August, the Catalyst Team has engaged in prayer walks around our community, connected one-on-one to learn more about individuals' needs and passions, and reviewed MissionInsite data - a census-based analysis of the community around our church. We are seeking to better understand what our community members want and need; how they spend their time; their fears and frustrations; and their perceptions about church. Practicing empathy will allow us to design experiences and environments where people find a sense of belonging and hopefully - prayerfully - begin a journey of faith.

I invite you to continue praying for our church and our team as we engage in the Catalyst process. I also invite you to be in prayer for the community around our church - for our neighbors - and to seek out opportunities to listen. Get to know the story of someone whose life or situation is different from yours, and practice empathy. You never know how that Christ-like connection will make an impact.

2022 has continued to impact our lives due to Covid and economic changes. This year there were changes for all of us and for the families and staff in the schools we help: Cedarmere Elementary and Glyndon Elementary. There are changes in staffing at both schools and challenges for students and teachers as schools work to educate children. Glyndon has a new guidance counselor and a social worker who are learning to know their students along with the continued support of a community liaison. Cedarmere has the same guidance counselor but there is need for other positions, including a nurse.

We will continue to support students at both schools at Thanksgiving with baskets and a gift cards for groceries as we have in the past.

For Christmas, we have decided to support our families as we did last year with groceries and gift cards which allow them to shop for what they need. The angel tree will have 'ornaments' as we have in the past the suggestions for cards to Target, Weis, Giant, Aldi, Lidl, and Wawa. Those stores are the best choices and will allow families to shop for what they need. Many of our families shop at ALDI, so those gift cards are welcome, too! The cards will be distributed according to family size based on information from the counselors.

Last year we were able to support our gift card program which helps with other outreach efforts! You don't have to wait till the Angel Tree is up to get started! And be looking for ways to help as we put the baskets together.





ATTENDING OUR HOME ANNUAL CONFERENCE

My family and I had the opportunity to go back home in the Democratic Republic of Congo this last summer. As per the provision of Global Ministries, clergy missionaries are required to attend the Annual Conference gathering where they hold their membership every three years. Because we arrived in Belize in September 2018, I was to attend the South Congo Annual Conference last year. But that did not happen because of the restrictions imposed by the COVID pandemic. We thank God that we were able to do so this year. Better late than never.

Our son Moses, my wife and I left Belize on June 14 and we arrived in Lubumbashi, DRC, our hometown on the 16th. The trip was long because we had to go through the USA and Ethiopia before getting to the destination. There is no direct flight.

All together these conferences have close to a million members. We could attend only two of those gatherings: South Congo Annual Conference and South West Katanga Annual Conference. It was great to visit and mingle with family and old friends. We were marveled to notice the tremendous growth of the Methodist Church in our land. It was uplifting to see that members of a local church in Lubumbashi have been able to put up a church building that has cost over 2.5 million dollars without any help from outside. This is an indication of good leadership and stewardship. All glory be to God!

FREE BACKPACKS FOR CHILDREN

The Carlton Arthurs Ministries based in Chicago, USA, has blessed the children of Dangriga on Saturday, September 3, 2022. A team of that ministry came all the way from Chicago to donate 400 backpacks to prepare the kids to go back to school. Each school bag contained pens, pencils, crayons, rulers, sharpeners, calculators, erasers, and socks. This is a great help especially for those parents who are struggling to find means to send their kids back to school this year. The event took place at Epworth Methodist Church here in Dangriga. The Mayor of Dangriga, Robert Mariano, was also present. He thanked the benefactors on behalf of all the inhabitants of his town.

This event happened as a result of a partnership that started a few years ago between the Methodist Church in Dangriga and the Carlton Arthurs' Ministries. Prior to this distribution of backpacks, the Carlton Arthurs Ministries brought a team of 40 people to do Vacation Bible School on the premises of our church from July 26-28. In the original plan the backpacks were to be distributed at the time as the VBS. It did not happen at that time because they failed to clear the backpacks at the Customs on that first trip. The team did not make to Belize in 2020 and 2021 due to the COVID pandemic. So, children of Dangriga in general and those of Methodist schools were happy to receive them with a big smile this year.

SCHOOL OPENING SERVICE

All primary schools in Belize opened their doors on Monday, September 5, 2022. So did the 4 schools that we have in the Stann Creek Circuit of the Methodist Church. Prior to school opening on Monday, we had on Sunday, September 4, a special school opening service at Epworth Methodist Church. All teachers and principals of the 4 primary schools of the Stann Creek Circuit, 55 persons in total, attended the service from 9:00am to 10:00am. During the service an emphasis was put on the important role that teachers play.

Bless them, Lord, and may they see even just a glimpse of how their faithfulness will forever impact generations to come. Amen."
