Experiencing God

Some years ago, Bishop Yeakel was going to come to our church to help us celebrate a huge milestone: paying off the mortgage. He sent me a letter asking that I provide him with the church's history so that he could prepare the sermon for the day. About ten days before the service, he called me and asked if I had sent him the right document. I was a bit flustered, a little panicked that I may have messed up – with the bishop, no less!

However, I had sent him what the church had. The church had been <u>several</u> different denominations, all predecessors to the United Methodist Church (they were Evangelical United Brethren before the merger in 1968), and their "history" was pretty much the list of names and addresses of the buildings. The bishop's question made me realize that I never again wanted a church that I had the privilege of serving as pastor to see their "history" as a procession of buildings or addresses or events but as experiences of God's presence and grace in our lives. (I apologize to those who have heard this story before. It was a milestone for me!)

Being a person of faith or being a faith family means, at its core, being related to God – praising, connecting with each other and with God through fellowship and caring, sharing and learning together, serving in missions and in leadership, and witnessing to how God meets us in our lives. We are very good at reporting on what we have done, talking about what we need to do, what we need to keep buildings presentable and in good repair, listing all of our projects and things like that. My spirit is often restless when I get to wondering about whether we recognize God's activity in our lives or God's presence in the world or God's voice of encouragement or direction or correction.

It makes me wonder: do we have a theological language?

How to Become a Member of RUMC

Membership in a United Methodist Church means taking on several responsibilities by making several promises.

We promise to pray for each other and the church, to be there — our presence, to offer our gifts of both time and money, to serve in the church and beyond the church, and to witness to our faith.

It is not necessary to be a member of RUMC to participate in pretty much all of our ministries. There are a few offices that a non-member cannot hold because of our church law, but other than that, you are welcome to be a fully participating part of the RUMC faith family. We will care for you in every way (such as funerals, weddings, etc.), whether you are a member or not.

It is my prayer that many of those who visit will feel called to become members of the church, but you are welcome to be part of our faith family for as long as you wish without becoming a member.

That said, there will be 2 opportunities in 2014 to become a member of RUMC: in April and again in the fall. Our membership process requires that you commit to attend 2 gatherings before new member Sunday and then be present on the special Sunday.

The Gatherings:

Sunday, October 19, about 11:45am. In the Fellowship Hall Vivian will meet with the prospective new members to talk together about being United Methodist. Lunch will be provided.

Wednesday, November 5, at 7 pm, the prospective new members will meet with the leaders of the church who will share about our ministries and get to know the new members.

Sunday, November 9, new members will join the church *at both Services* (whichever one you normally attend), and a special coffee hour will be held so that new members may be acquainted with the congregation.

Food Pantry and Community Kitchen



The Food Pantry reached a new high, handing out 230 bags in August. In addition, we handed out school supplies to around 75 students.

Unfortunately, our donations dropped off this summer, right when our need grew. We had to purchase a lot of food over the summer, tapping into our financial reserve. Can you help with a financial or food donation? Or perhaps you know a business that might hold a food drive or make a year-end donation?

We have been able to add meat to our bags, thanks to the generosity of the Westminster Rescue Mission. They have shared their overflow of donated meat twice a month.

For the months of November and December, we would like to add holiday items to our bags. We are now collecting stuffing, mashed potatoes, gravy, cranberry sauce, dessert mixes, cookies, etc. in addition to our regular staple items.

We are also accepting fall and winter clothes at the food pantry. Remember that we have no storage space for off-season clothes; please do not send in shorts and summer items. Clothes must be clean, and in good condition.

The Community Lunch served 52 in September. We also sent home 35 take-out meals and froze 26 meals for the food pantry. Our next lunch will be October 4 at 11:30. If you would like to help with prep work on Friday or Saturday, please contact Lani Hoffmann at 410-526-6967 or lani05@verizon.net.



Dear Friends



Imagine how we felt when we met with four of the men on a Thursday evening and learned that their "camp" in the woods had been demolished by the authorities. Until now, the group had been observed but left alone. And now, "for no reason" it was gone, their charcoal grill demolished, their tarp confiscated, and their "stuff" thrown in the dumpster! We passed out some picnic lunches and bottled water, and listened. And listened. I guess we are also God's ears....

One man said he loved the Gospel of John and spoke from this book most of the night. He said he's read the Bible but doesn't have one now. His face lit up when we promised to bring him one, and we would like to provide a Bible for the other men who are interested as well. Another man, with tears in his eyes, said that he feels God calling him...calling him to change his life, to stop drinking, and come back to church.

The group is concerned -- they see the geese in V formations up above and know that cold weather is coming. One of them spent last winter in the camp, with fourdegree weather. Another has only been out of work for four weeks and needs a steady job -- he has a wife and three children back home, and is assisting his father in delivering sermons each week (the father uses Spanish and the son translates into English)! At least three of the men are bilingual.
