FROM THE PASTOR

Many of you have heard me refer to our congregation as our "faith family." October offers a particularly good opportunity for us to consider what that means — or at least what I mean when I use that term. In my experience, I have heard person after person after person talk about how their church is special because there is a feeling of being part of a family. Many of you told me that when I arrived at RUMC as your pastor.

"Family" can be a loaded word. Families can be strong, loving, and supportive and can provide the nurturing from which children develop into mature, loving adults. And families can be battlegrounds. Church families can be all of that, too, and without intending to do so, those who are in the church family do not always recognize when it is difficult to gain admittance to that family.

Families don't all look alike – especially now – and in the family of faith, it is essential that we remember that God created and loves us all – no exceptions. When our human choices and definitions of family make exceptions, God's people (especially those that do not fit those human definitions) are marginalized and excluded. More and more often, God's children exclude themselves from the family of faith when they feel marginalized.

So, in order to be clear as to what I mean when I refer to our "faith family," here are a few pointers:

- Everyone is a Child of God, a brother or sister born into the family of God and welcome to the particular branch of the faith family that gathers at RUMC. This faith family includes people of many ethnicities, races, and life experiences. Some are married and have 2.7 children, a dog and a cat or a donkey. Some live in households of one. And every possible combination in between. Some have reached the highest echelons of education while others did not graduate from high school and some cannot read. Some of us make very comfortable incomes that give us many choices and buying power; others aren't sure whether there is enough money this month to buy both medicine and groceries.
- Loving our brothers and sisters in Christ will sometimes involve disagreement or frustration as we seek to
 be family with each other. We will not always resolve those disagreements or frustration, but we can
 choose to engage the conversation with love and grace and do our best to grow together.
- Loving our brothers and sisters will always involve "watching over one another in love" which includes providing safety for those who are vulnerable. That means we will set boundaries such as our Safe Sanctuary policies and abide by them. It also means that when one of our brothers or sisters is unable to abide by them, we will work with that person to find other ways to be part of the family.
- Loving our brothers and sisters in Christ also means that we will seek to offer moments of blessing and support sometimes individually (such as prayer before a surgery or our prayer chain that receives prayer re-

quests from the pastor or individuals) and sometimes in a congregational worship setting. *This month we have* **2** special services related to this aspect of our "faith family business" which set me to thinking about this article. We will bless our pets and pray with families who have lost children – special moments for distinct groups within our faith family.

Families – even the best families – can be messy. Sometimes we have this picture of perfection where no one ever raises a voice, "the women are strong, the men are good-looking and the children are all above average (thanks, Garrison Keillor!)," there is never a burned chocolate chip cookie, and every room in the house (apartment, condo, etc.) looks like it came out of *Southern Living*. The strongest, healthiest families find ways to cope with the mess and work things out for the benefit of the whole family. They figure it out when the rules (both spoken and unspoken) aren't working anymore. They talk about what's going on with each other, sharing their experiences, their dreams and their challenges. They provide support for each other through thick and thin. They figure out how they will use their family's resources and provide for the family's needs. They remind each other of what is important. And they love each other – persistently, fiercely, unconditionally.

My prayer is that our life together as the RUMC faith family will look like that!



Inspired by a national observance for grieving parents, we will offer a brief prayer service for all parents who have lost children. At the end of the service, parents will take home a candle to use during the national observance later that week, Wave of Light, when families are invited to light a candle at 7 pm on October 15 and leave it burning for 1 hour, joined by the light of their candles with families the world over who have lost a child or a pregnancy.



From the Food Pantry and Community Kitchen — The Food Pantry is looking for new blood!

We have a great group of volunteers that work every week to serve over 600 families that come through our door each year. But many of these volunteers could use a day off every once in awhile. I would love to train some new people so that others can get a well deserved rest. Perhaps you would consider working just one day (2-3 hours) a month. The food pantry handed out 259 bags in AUGUST. I think that is a new record. Thank you to everyone who donated school supplies for our local kids – we handed out at least 50 full bags of supplies.

Our food donations were way down during the summer, causing us to have to purchase more food than usual. Items most needed are:

Cereal, canned veggies, canned fruit, tuna, peanut butter, soup, pasta and sauce, rice and macaroni and cheese. We also always have a need for shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, vegetable oil, mayo and crackers.

It's not too early to talk to businesses, schools, and other organizations about Holiday food drives.

Donations: please remember to leave any donations (including clothes) for the food pantry in the designated bins in the Narthex or in the large laundry hamper by the Fellowship Hall. Please don't leave bags in stairwells, hallways, the old kitchen, outside the church doors or on the ramp to the food pantry. If you have a large donation of several bags of clothes or household items – give Lani and call and we can arrange for a special drop.





It's THAT time of year again!

Come to church and get the Flu Shot all in one day! The clinic will be October 18th from 8:30 am until 10:30 am. PLEASE NOTE TIME!! The LAST sign up slot will be 10:15.

The flu shots are free for those on Medicare (with proper ID) and \$30-\$35 for everyone else. If you attend the late service please



make plans to be early! The company doing our vaccinations each year (Medstar Health) requires a certain number for each date to attend our clinic! Sign-up Thank you! Tracy Tambaoan, RN BSN - Parish Nurse - Health Ministry Team"

The regular shot is \$35, the flu mist and thimerosal-free are \$40, the high dose is \$55, Pneumovax is \$100, and Prevnar is \$190. Prevnar, Pneumovax, and the flu vaccine are no cost for Medicare Part B eligible participants. You will get a receipt if you pay, then you can submit to your flexible spending accounts if you want to be reimbursed.
