From the Pastor

Summer has flown by. School has begun. And I have been hearing from many of you about life balance – or maybe it's lack thereof?

Do you remember that image of a calendar that I shared with you months ago? At the beginning of 2014, I think it was. My friend wrote a blog about a blank calendar – the same blank calendar that all of us have to fill. Every day is like a blank canvas, and we each choose how to use the minutes and hours available to us.

There is a gripping song entitled *Seasons of Love* in the Broadway musical, *Rent*, with a chorus that goes:

Five Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Six Hundred Minutes
Five Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Moments so dear

In the movie version, the song is sung by the whole company, and the scene that always comes to my mind is when Jesse Martin (whose character is "Roger," a man diagnosed with AIDS/HIV) sings a solo verse, contemplating the woman he loves who is dying of AIDS. This song has been used as a kind of reflection on endings. My friend's blog encourages us to consider those precious moments ahead of moments like that – to consider how we invest our time.

Is your time invested the way you want it to be? What are the things that are high on your list of values? Does time slip away and you suddenly realize that you have not invested your time in what you see as your calling? Have you realized that you haven't been investing an adequate number of those precious minutes with family and others dear to you? Investing or just spending – to me there is a huge difference!

Psalm 90, verse 12 is a prayer – perhaps it's not too dramatic to say an "urgent" prayer – asking God to *Teach us to count our days*. The Psalm begins with a declaration that *The Lord has been our dwelling place for generations* and then becomes a prayer asking that God have patience with us – God's children who often forget God's ways.

Teach us to live well! Teach us to live wisely and well! (Eugene Peterson's version in *The Message*)

Right now I am praying for all of us to ***live well***. I am also praying that all of us will live in ways that will give us the deep satisfaction of knowing that we have

- served God and loved our families and those dear to us to the best of our ability,
- reached out in love to our neighbors, and
- continued to grow spiritually.

The next worship series begins on September 13, when we will spend 3 weeks focusing on the theology and history of John Wesley.

OH WOW!!

During this vacation break, of which I've never taken before, I was approached by a church member in one of the many food outlets in our Reisterstown community with, "I missed your song leading!" My reply, "I'm on vacation."

Arriving home after that conversation with a wonderful friend, I began to think about "song leading." Why we practice this and what are the results we want to see and hear.

First, I have spent my life working with voices, both teens and adults. Because of the teachings of my mentor, the late Robert Shaw, my ears were opened to, and made aware of nuances in pitch, rhythm, diction, and balance.

Second, the focus on melody, again through Robert Shaw, and Clydesdale, Goss, and a host of others, strengthened my desire to work on arrangements of folk literature, hymns, and spirituals. During my earlier years at Peabody, I could not change notes, or chords, or rhythms. I had to own the melody, respect the structure, words, phrases, verse and sequence. I learned to think counter point for more than harmony for church singing of hymns. **Today** however, my harmonies are all over the spectrum. 😊

Song leaders must sing the melody with conviction, hope and love. They must set an example for you to follow. I remember acappella singing in the church in 2002-3 with wonderful voices singing the great hymns of the faith and doing so with freedom and gusto. They were not being correct to the music page but being correct to the song with feeling and vitality.

So, in closing, I look forward to our time together on September 20, 2015 at 10:30 am. It will be an introduction to a wonderful season of incredible anthems and yeh...hymn singing. As you sing, communicate your love for Jesus Christ.

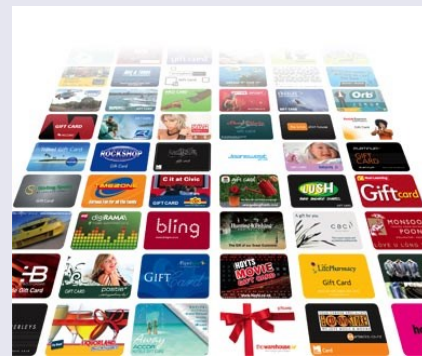
And! To assist with our travel and eating expenses, the VIM team members are having a car wash.

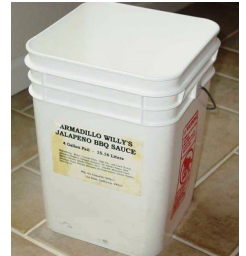

It's THAT time of year again!

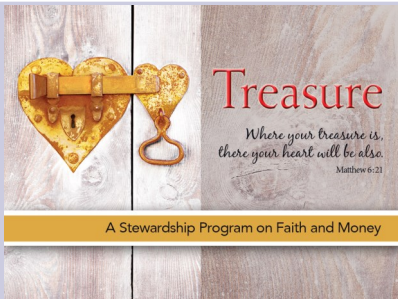
Come to church and get the Flu Shot all in one day! The clinic will be **October 18th from 8:30 am until 10:30 am. PLEASE NOTE TIME!! The LAST sign up slot will be 10:15.** The flu shots are free for those on Medicare (with proper ID) and \$30-\$35 for everyone else. If you attend the late service please make plans to be early! The company doing our vaccinations each year (Medstar Health) requires a certain number for each date to attend our clinic! Sign-up Thank you! Tracy Tambaoan, RN BSN - Parish Nurse - Health Ministry Team"



The regular shot is \$35, the flu mist and thimerosal-free are \$40, the high dose is \$55, Pneumovax is \$100, and Prevnar is \$190. Prevnar, Pneumovax, and the flu vaccine are no cost for Medicare Part B eligible participants. You will get a receipt if you pay, then you can submit to your flexible spending accounts if you want to be reimbursed.



- * September in one of our Cookie Months. Donations of homemade cookies, store-bought cookies, and other snacks individually wrapped are acceptable such as bags of pretzels or cheese crackers. Place all donations in the BCC box in the Narthex or give to Cindy Smith if you think things will break.
